### Safety on the PSM

#### Introduction

Safety is the responsibility of all everybody who works in the Mail Centre and it is important that all SSOW are followed as they have been developed to protect you, and your colleagues that work on the Parcel Sort Machine.

We have recently seen people overriding safety systems and this has led to three incidents where one of our engineers has been injured or could have been injured.

#### **Overview**

When working on the eject station of the PSM there is a jog push button to start the conveyor belt as illustrated below, this should be pressed when requried to move ejects along the belt to the table where they can be sorted.

There have been 3 incidents reported where this button has been fastened down with elastic bands so the belt runs continuously, that have resulted in parcels becoming stuck between the belt and the table. Engineers have then been called and there have been 2 near misses and an accident.

The engineers can be seriously injured if this safety mechanism has been overridden.

There are no circumstances under which this action is acceptable and by interfering with a safety button you are risking serious injury to your colleagues.

Anyone found to be in breach of the SSOW may be subject to disciplinary action. Section 7 of the Health and Safety at Work Act puts a duty upon employees to take reasonable care for the health and safety of themselves and of other persons who may be affected by their acts and omissions at work.



- Never fasten the jog push button down so that the conveyor moves continuously
